AS **HIGHER** education here enters an unfamiliar phase, planners can no longer afford to "extrapolate from the past" or mimic Western models of success.

Instead, a bold, new course is needed – one that is more comprehensive in its offerings, more flexible in allowing for alternative paths and more open in its embrace of the international.

Presidential hopeful and education sector veteran Tony Tan offered these suggestions at a public lecture yesterday, as he articulated his vision on the future of tertiary learning in Singapore.

"We are no longer playing catch-up with Britain, the United States, or anyone else. We have caught up. We have to start charting our own path," he said in a wide-ranging speech that also traced the history of **higher education** here.

On comprehensiveness, he said schools must offer "the widest range of programmes to the widest range of people". They must be able to host courses in areas where there is heavy demand, but also in areas of "emerging or niche demand", to adapt to the global consumer who is more varied in his tastes. 3. Tips

a) How can I browse articles published on a particular date?

i) Click on "Advanced Search" from the home page.

ii) In Advanced Search, perform the following steps:

b) How do I view the PDFs of articles with more than one page?

Only the first PDF page is shown at the basic search mode.

i. If you wish to view **ALL** the PDFs of an article, you will have to first find out the other PDF page numbers.



ii. Go to Advanced Search and perform the following steps:

c) How do I capture and access the permalink of a full text article?

i) Capturing a Permalink (Permanent link to the full text)

After clicking an article headline to view the full text, copy the URL link in the browser's address field above and save it.
