


## Introduction

Newslink is an online newspaper archival service. The database covers news stories and articles written by Singapore Press Holdings (SPH) journalists excluding stories from news agencies such as Reuters, AP, AFP, etc. Articles will be available on the next working day after publication, except for weekends (Saturday, Sunday & Monday issues will appear on Tuesday).

### 3. Tips

#### a) How can I browse articles published on a particular date?

i) Click on “Advanced Search” from the home page.



ii) In Advanced Search, perform the following steps:

#### ADVANCED GENERAL SEARCH

**b) How do I view the PDFs of articles with more than one page?**

Only the first PDF page is shown at the basic search mode.

i. If you wish to view **ALL** the PDFs of an article, you will have to first find out the other PDF page numbers.



ii. Go to Advanced Search and perform the following steps:

**ADVANCED GENERAL SEARCH**



Publications:  Select the publication

Publication Date: From (dd/MM/yyyy)  To (dd/MM/yyyy)  Select the same publication date in both fields  
(Hint: Set date range up to 2 years only)

Search:  in  Select "Full Page PDF"

Section:

Page No.:  Type in the PDF page number for one of the other PDF pages

Click **Submit**

iii. Click the **page number** or **thumbnail image** to view or download the PDF page.




iv. Repeat Steps ii –iii for the other PDF pages if necessary.

## c) How do I capture and access the permalink of a full text article?

### i) Capturing a Permalink (Permanent link to the full text)

After clicking an article headline to view the full text, copy the URL link in the browser's address field above and save it.



d) What do I do if I see a login box on the left and/or a message when using Newslink?




You may encounter the above **login box** when you enter the Newslink site.

- iii) Connect to Newslink again. You should be prompted to login with your NIE Login Account.
- iv) You should see a "Welcome, nie!" message on the screen if you have successfully logged in.
